Funds will serve the most vulnerable youth who are in need of accessible, affordable skills training. The organization targets disadvantaged young people ages 16–25 living in and around Hanoi, Hue and Danang.

Funds will develop an information booklet and Train-the-Trainer modules on how to recognize and prevent child trafficking; funds will also help advocate for the approval of Georgia Senate Resolution (SR) 7.

Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking, Los Angeles, California **\$5,000.00**

Funds will help identify, serve, and provide comprehensive case management and advocacy services for children who have survived all forms of human trafficking. Funds will be used to provide mental-health and physiotherapy services to survivors of torture, war trauma, and other extreme human rights abuses who live in two areas of Kenya—Dadaab Refugee Camp, near the Somali border, and refugees now living in Nairobi.

Funds will be used for a workshop that will equip church leaders who are women, as well as future leaders, to understand the link between the oppression of women and environmental exploitation in the context of global economics. Time will be spent on advocacy work, skills training and methods to be used with governments and inter-government institutions.

Emuci Fonds Exterieurs, Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire \$8,000.00
Funds will provide healthy food to 80–100 children ages 6 months–2 years in Dabou, promoting the normal growth and development that results from adequate nutrition. Food-prep classes for mothers will be offered, as well.

Evangelical Methodist Church of Bolivia, La Paz, Bolivia \$7,000.00
Funds will be used for staff supporting the Women's Coordinator to develop and implement programming for women in the church.

Funds will be used to equip indigenous women of the Methodist Church of Bolivia through vocational training in leadership, business and agriculture under the umbrella of faith and justice.

Funds will be used to eliminate poverty, which is becoming a youth phenomenon in the Caribbean. The GARD center will offer technical, vocational and entrepreneurial training to 60 youth ages 17–35 over a two-year period to prepare them to compete in a global economy.

Global Health Action, Atlanta, Georgia **\$10,000.00**

Funds will be used for a project to improve the health and well-being of rural Chinese youth by providing information and services in seven counties in Jiangsu Province in southwest China. The marginalized rural children and youth, ages 11–15, whose parents left home to pursue jobs live with elder caregivers.

Grace Ministries, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia **\$7,000.00**

Funds will support salaries for the doctors, nurses, pharmacist and bookkeeper of Grace Hospice in Grace Ministries of Mongolia—formerly General Board of Global Ministries of Mongolia—who provide medical and palliative care to all who seek assistance with cancer care.

Grace United Methodist Church, St. Petersburg, Russia **\$7,500.00**

Funds will be used for outreach more than 200 children with disabilities, family substance abuse issues, and domestic violence experiences at the United Methodist Spring Center, a social church outreach program.

Grassroots International, Boston, Massachusetts **\$10,000.00**

Funds will be used to generate income and healthy food through ecologically sound methods that sustain and protect rural livelihoods. Funds will also will add a women's writing effort to enhance Palestinian women's advocacy skills.

GRENCODA, Gouyave, Grenada **\$10,000.00**

Funds will be used for keeping children and youth meaningfully engaged and risk-free during the summer school holidays, when parents work and the children are on their own. Participants learn rudimentary skills in safety, work environment behavior, literacy, and numeracy as needed, as well as how to develop positive attitudes, values, and spiritual growth.

Haitian Artisans for Peace, Grand Rapids, Michigan **\$10,000.00**

Funds will be used to empower women with tools that will improve their personal finances and health so they can raise a stronger family in the La Vallée communal section of Ridore, Haiti. Midwifery training and certification are also offered for safer maternal and child health and as employment possibilities.

Hesperian Foundation, Berkeley, California **\$10,000.00**

Funds will be used to improve and increase the capacity of women in Latin America to use advocacy and action to address violence and gender inequalities within their communities and workplaces.

Hope Foundation for African Women, Nairobi, Kenya **\$10,000.00**

Funds will be used to advance human rights and improve the economic wellbeing and health of Kenyan women, children and youth in the sub-county of Borabu. This project will use popular education methods whereby the community identifies the problems it wishes to address and collectively develops solutions.
