INTERNATIONAL MINISTRIES PROGRAM GRANTS

Source of funds: Mission Giving and endowments designated for international mission (unless otherwise noted)

Accion Medica Cristiana, Managua, Nicaragua **\$8,000.00**

Funds will support the purchase of livestock and the development of a livestock bank with organized groups of women from Kukra River. A training plan will be created and implemented to promote the role of women in the management of fair family microeconomics, sustainability and community building.

Funds will be used to support workshops on prenatal and postnatal health and nutrition, breastfeeding, disease prevention and parenting.

Part of the program is aimed at strengthening the Family Follow-up staff who will be able to better support the families. Funds will facilitate awareness programs aimed at the prevention of child sexual abuse.

Lao Samphan Methodist Church Women, Mueang Nong Khai District, Thailand **\$10,000.00**

Funds will support the Lao Samphan Methodist Church to organize women’s groups and provide through leadership training, skills development and education.

Methodist Church of Boa Vista Roraima, Boa Vista, Brazil **\$3,000.00**

Funds will empower Warao indigenous women with basic kitchen and craft courses so they are able to compete in the labor market of Brazil. Funds will also teach Warao children Portuguese so that they have access to public school, which will help keep them from becoming mendicant.

Support services will also be provided for orphans and disabled children.

Mission for Migrant Workers (MFMW), Ltd., Hong Kong, SAR China **\$10,000.00**

Funds will support the Crisis Intervention and Prevention through Migrant Empowerment project, which provides legal, economic, mental and emotional relief to migrant women in crisis, and raises the status, protection and equal treatment of Asian migrant domestic workers, 98 percent of whom are women.

Nepal Mahila Bishwasi Sangh, Kathmandu, Nepal **\$8,000.00**

Funds will be used to support a project that serves women who are pregnant or of child-bearing age in marginalized, destitute and remote areas of the country. They will be trained on the available resources and services for maternal care. They will also be provided with skills to make nutritional food for babies (sarbatram pitho, super porridge, etc.).

Operation Hope, Nairobi, Kenya **\$10,000.00**

Funds will support a project that enhances women's rights protection in the context of prevention of mother-to-child transmission of HIV (PMTCT) programs. The project will institute appropriate informed consent safeguards for HIV testing among women by sensitizing and explaining the "opt-out" testing procedure in a neutral and unbiased manner.

Opportunity School, Chennai, India **\$10,000.00**

Funds will be used to provide special education to children with developmental disabilities. In addition, students will learn employable skills in order to become more independent.

ProLiteracy, Syracuse, New York (Kenya) **\$7,000.00**

Funds will be used to support a project to equip women to use their new literacy skills to start small income-generating enterprises. ProLiteracy will work with a local partner, Kenya Adult Learners Association (KALA), to translate and culturally adapt our Small Business Basics manual into Swahili. The manual will be used to teach basic business principles to 150 women, some of whom will be eligible to receive small stipends to launch their small businesses after completing the training program.
