## **GRANTS**

### **INTERNATIONAL MINISTRIES PROGRAM GRANTS**

*Source of funds: Mission Giving, Call to Prayer and Self-Denial Offering 2019 and endowments designated for international mission (unless otherwise noted)*

#### **Accion Medica Cristiana (AMC), Managua, Nicaragua **\$5,000.00****

Funds will be used to strengthen the institutional and community capacity for the protection of the rights of children and teenagers (up to age 18). Through the development of an institutional policy on child protection and advocacy, the training of AMC staff and community leaders and a public awareness campaign, the benefitting population will be more equipped with knowledge to recognize and reduce the violation of these rights.

#### **Agency Women of West Congo, Kinshasa, Democratic Republic of Congo **\$6,000.00****

Funds will support an agricultural cooperative project that will benefit young mothers. The project will provide training on business and agriculture, providing these young women with important skill to survive. Trainings will also be provided to community leaders to work toward ending the discrimination of girls and young women.

#### **Amity Foundation, Hong Kong, SAR China **\$10,000.00****

Funds will provide financial support to female students from poor rural families who would otherwise be unable to afford a university education. The project also provides personal development training in order to enhance their personal capability and prepare them for future careers.

#### **Anna Tillou Cottage for Mentally Challenged Women, Chennai, India **\$7,000.00****

Funds will help provide housing, health care, and rehabilitation to women who are mentally challenged.

#### **Ann Cares Foundation, Chennai, Tamil Nadu, India **\$6,000.00****

Funds will help children who are diagnosed with cancer and their parents to have access to resources and information they require to ensure they get appropriate support. Ann Cares Foundation will provide medical, nutritional, transportation, temporary shelter, psychosocial and education support for the less privileged child and the family are in need.

*Through: Myrtle Social Welfare Network, Chennai, India*

#### **Asociación red de Mujeres para el Desarrollo, San José, Costa Rica **\$7,000.00****

Funds will be used to train women entrepreneurs in business and financial management and empower them to make decisions for the development of their own projects and ventures. Women will be trained specifically as producers of cocoa and bananas.

#### **Association for Theological Education in Myanmar, Yangon, Myanmar **\$4,000.00****

Funds will be used to provide two writer and leader development workshops. Essays from the workshops will be collected in a book entitled *Ecumenical in Myanmar*. These workshops are an ongoing program in partnership with India Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge (ISPCK).

**Batis Center for Women, Quezon City, Philippines \$10,000.00**

Funds will be used to help raise public awareness about the trafficking of Filipino women through marriage. Resources from this grant will also be used to support trafficking survivors' push for a foreign divorce/annulment decrees to be recognized in the Philippines, thereby reducing those barriers to justice.

**Board of Women's Work, The United Methodist Church Philippines Central Conference, Manila, Philippines \$10,000.00**

Funds will support a program that seeks to engage church women and youth in faith and life dialogue, reflecting on and responding to the challenges of our prophetic task to "...bring good news to the poor... to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Luke 4:18). Through this program, women and youth will put their collective prayers and faith into action by concretely addressing violence, oppression and injustices which greatly affect the most vulnerable groups in the society—women, youth and children.

**Centre for Action and Rural Education (CARE), Erode, Talmi Nadu, India \$5,000.00**

Funds will support an economic empowerment program for people who are low-income and living with HIV/AIDS. Participants will be able to purchase cows and/or goats and be trained on how to care for the animals.

**Centro Popular para América Latina de Comunicación (CEPALC), Bogotá, Colombia \$7,000.00**

Funds will support the training of indigenous and Afro-Columbian young women in the knowledge and promotion of their rights and social values to create justice and peace in their community and the acquisition of radio and television journalism skills.

**Clinic Methodist Clint Rabb, Columbian United Methodist Church, Medellin, Columbia \$8,000.00**

Funds will support a project that aims to improve the health status of the most vulnerable members of indigenous and Afro-Colombian communities through community health education, targeted screening and treatment. It will address the absence of any preventative care (antenatal visits and childhood development checks) and the lack of health-hygiene education, which contribute to high maternal and childhood morbidity in the area.

**Ecumenical Development Foundation (EDF), Lukasa, Zambia \$5,400.00**

Funds will support the drilling of a borehole, pump installation and seeds for new crops. The Kanakantapa area in Chongwe district has been affected with a severe drought, which has resulted in crop failure. EDF serves five surrounding villages and will provide training in organic farming and crop production.

**Federación de Mujeres Metodistas, Buenos Aires, Argentina \$6,000.00**

Funds will be used to train women in sewing, knitting and handicrafts in order to produce high-quality marketable products, and to subsidize the purchase of sewing machines and other materials to set up the training centers.

**Federacion Femenina Metodista (FEFEME), La Iglesia Evangelica Metodista en Bolivia, Ciudad de La Paz, Bolivia \$7,500.00**

Funds will be used to support the salaries of the Bolivian Methodist Women Coordinator and her secretary.

**Global Health Action, Atlanta, Georgia (China) **\$5,000.00****

Funds will be used to help support the first year of a multi-faceted and multi-year engagement to build the capacity of the national, provincial and local government and civil society for better health and well-being outcomes for families across China. This project focuses on building the capacity of China's National Health Commission to develop policies and practice to support quality daycare services for children between the ages of 0-3.

**Global Network of Women Peacebuilders,  
Washington, DC (Democratic Republic of the Congo) **\$8,000.00****

Funds will be used to sustain and expand advocacy and programming for women's economic empowerment, economic justice, better access to and control over resources, higher incomes in the eastern region of the Democratic Republic of Congo. Consequently, the grant will also be used to advocate for greater protection of Congolese women and girls from sexual and gender-based violence.

**Grassroots International, Boston, Massachusetts (Palestine) **\$8,000.00****

Funds will be used to decrease the vulnerability to food insecurity among small-scale female farmers in the occupied Palestinian territories by converting available home backyards and surrounding areas into a sustainable source of food and income.

**Haitian Artisans for Peace, Grand Rapids, Michigan (Haiti) **\$8,000.00****

Funds will be used to sustain and expand the maternal health 'Start Right' program, which provides antenatal care, maternity education and obstetric services to women living in rural, southern Haiti. The program saves the lives of mothers and newborns and helps them "start right" with healthy birth weights and ongoing postnatal and infant services.

**Hope Foundation for African Women, Nairobi, Kenya **\$5,000.00****

Funds will support a project to improve the health and economic well-being of women, children and youth living in Nyamira County through intervention and education that will lead to the abandonment of female genital mutilation (FGM), while also addressing structural gender inequalities through economic empowerment.

**Iglesia Evangelica Metodista Unida Del Ecuador, Quito, Ecuador **\$8,000.00****

Funds will support the Church Ministries for Integral Development of Children, Teenagers and Families Program, which are located in impoverished communities and works to provide better opportunities for schooling and spiritual growth, fight against hunger and malnutrition, seek to improve health and develop a culture of peace and equity.

**Imayam Social Welfare Association, Coimbatore, India **\$6,000.00****

Funds will support training on menstrual health and hygiene and provide safe drinking water facilities and hygienic toilet facilities for school children in 10 schools at Karamadai block, Mettupalayam Taluk, Coimbatore district. Funds will help purchase equipment such as water purifiers and sanitary pads dispensers and incinerators at the schools.

**Indian Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge (ISPCK), Delhi, India **\$6,000.00****

Funds will support rural women to build capacity through various skills (sewing, paper making and candle making) enabling them to become economic contributors. Products will be marketed by the ISPCK for sustenance of their families, leading to a life of dignity and economic independence. Students will also learn how to read and be trained in gender equity and community development.

**Indian Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge (ISPCK), Delhi, India **\$10,000.00****

Funds will be used to provide writer workshops and leadership development to theologically trained women in India. ISPCK will publish the participants articles and books once the workshops are complete.

*Source of funds: Gamble Memorial Literature Fund*

**Kapatiran-Kaunlaran Foundation, Manila, Philippines **\$10,000.00****

Funds will support a program that provides protection services to street and working children aged 3-17, who-are-out of school and living inside the Manila North Cemetery and in Tondo District, through the provision of alternative education, health and medical assistance, psychosocial assistance and life skills trainings. Their parents/guardians will be mobilized to participate in the project and will be provided with seminars on parents' effectiveness and activities towards prevention and protection of their children. Livelihood trainings and opportunities to earn additional income will also be given to parents especially for mothers.

**Lao Samphan Methodist Church Women, Vientiane, Laos **\$5,000.00****

Funds will support education opportunities for young women, giving them the option of choosing to pursue education and livelihood training instead of opting for early marriages.

**Mission for Migrant Workers (MFMW), Ltd., Hong Kong, SAR China **\$7,500.00****

Funds will provide multi-form welfare services to victims of violence against women, developing capacity for peer support in outreach activities called Migrant Caring Centres and campaign for suitable accommodation especially for women migrant domestic workers vis-a-vis the mandatory live-in policy.

**Operation Hope, Nairobi, Kenya **\$6,000.00****

Funds will support the Enhancing Access to Maternal Child Health Care through Advocacy (EAMCHA) Project. This is a one-year project aimed at mobilizing communities and their leaders to push for legislation to ensure the right to the highest attainable standard of health, including reproductive health and emergency treatment.

**Opportunity School, Chennai, India **\$9,000.00****

Funds will be used for scholarships for special education to children with mental disabilities. Students will learn employable skills in order to become more independent.

**Pasumai Ulagam, Erode, Talmi Nadu India **\$5,000.00****

Funds will be used to help stop the sexual abuse of children through formation of child protection committees in villages, schools and workplaces and raising awareness among parents, students and volunteers.

**Shade and Fresh Water Project, São Paulo, Brazil **\$7,500.00****

Funds will support an expansion of the project to include an after-school program to create activities and workshops for at-risk youth between 15 and 18 years of age. With the expansion, Shade and Fresh Water will be able to continue to assist some of its teens and new ones through the most crucial and vulnerable times of their lives.

**Shalom Reconciliation Ministry, Kotido, Uganda **\$10,000.00****

Funds from this grant will be used to build upon the programs for youth within Kotido Town by completing the youth center located at Shalom Home, recruiting staff for key positions to offer the mentoring and program oversight. The Youth Center will require furnishing and resources and the hope is that the ministry will be able to see the project completed and serving youth by the end of the year.

**Shared Interest, New York, New York (Mozambique) **\$10,000.00****

Funds will be used to assess the needs of projects that have been affected by Cyclone Idai, helping them move forward so that smallholder farmer cooperatives can recover and build resilience for the future. Shared Interest will also continue work with local United Methodist Church groups to provide business training and credit access.

**Tbilisi Youth House Foundation, Tbilisi, Republic of Georgia **\$10,000.00****

Funds will be used to provide comprehensive education to high school students and raising their awareness on the importance of quality health care. They will be given an opportunity to acquire life skills and develop positive attitudes and values that will become a part of the young people's emotional and social development.

**United Methodist Church of Zimbabwe, Harare, Zimbabwe **\$8,000.00****

Funds will support a project that works to empower women and young girls from Masvingo District of the Zimbabwe West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church. The livelihood project is on poultry production to restart their livelihood after the cyclone Idai and floods. The project will target 150 women and girls from the district. Each will be trained on poultry keeping, given chicks and feeds to start up their project; trained on book keeping for their project funds; refresher trainings which will be aimed at identifying the gaps and challenges; leadership development and to provide networks for building market linkages and financial institutions.

**United Methodist Women Association Cameroon, Yaoundé, Cameroon **\$5,000.00****

Funds will support a project that will train community members to end Gender Based Violence (GBV) and provide support services for survivors.

**United Methodist Women, Liberia Annual Conference, Monrovia, Liberia **\$7,000.00****

Funds will support the salary of the new United Methodist Women Coordinator of the Liberia Annual Conference. This Coordinator position administers the mission and program of United Methodist Women in Liberia.

Funds will be used to support the production of reusable cloth sanitary pads, made of local materials and will be produced by women in Conference United Methodist Women training centers throughout the country. It

will facilitate empowerment skills, as the manufacturing of this product will be incorporated into our current sewing curriculum, which prepares students for a tailoring career. This project will help ensure that girls' school attendance is not disrupted by the lack of adequate feminine protection.

**United Methodist Women Mozambique Annual Conference North, Beira, Mozambique \$10,000.00**

Funds will support emergency relief efforts that directly assist women, children and youth with basic human needs in the aftermath of Cyclone Idai.

The women will receive seed money and training that will enable them to start micro businesses (fabric dyeing and production, headdress making, animal husbandry and hair styling).

**United Methodist Women Sierra Leone Annual Conference, Freetown, Sierra Leone** **\$6,000.00**

Funds will support the work of the Women's Desk Coordinator and her participation on the Country Team.

**Women Desk of Pakistan Lahore District, Punjab, Pakistan** **\$9,000.00**

Funds will be used to help the Women Desk open Skill Training Centers for poor village women on in church campuses of Lahore Diocese Church of Pakistan. It will enable young girls and women to equip themselves with marketable skills such as stitching, sewing, computer and self-grooming, which will help them to earn an income without having to depend on others.

**AK Child & Family, Anchorage, Alaska** **\$15,000.00**

Funds will be used to support the Spiritual Life Program, which is part of the residential and holistic care for youth with trauma.

**Alpine Community Center, Alpine, Texas** **\$15,000.00**

Funds will be used to support qualified caregivers at the daycare center. Alpine Community Center serves people of various backgrounds, cultures and social economical levels of the area.

**Atlantic Street Center, Seattle, Washington** **\$15,000.00**

Funds will be used to support the Teens as Parents Program. A portion of the grant will go towards supplementing the salary of a part-time Teen Parent Case Manager who will work directly with the teen parents to help them become more stable via job placement, housing assistance and child development education. The remainder will go to providing direct services for the teen parents such as rental assistance (application fees, deposits, etc.), diapers and formula for babies, as well as employment/job search related expenses such as interview coaching, resume assistance and purchasing of workforce appropriate clothing.

**Bethlehem Center, Jackson, Mississippi** **\$15,000.00**

Funds will support Project Readiness, a computer based multi-generational learning initiative that uses technology to help improve learning and social skills in children and youth. This is a new project approach to help the children be school ready.

Funds will support the K-12th grade Out of School Time (OST) year-round program. The program is designed to facilitate the healthy development of 95 participants socially, emotionally and academically. The overall goal of the program is that students graduate from high school on-time with a developed career plan.

Funds will be used to support a Meals on Wheels Program for 216 elderly North Nashville citizens who are homebound, frail and live below the national Health and Human Service poverty line. The Meals on Wheels Program provides a hot, nutritious and healthy meal every Monday through Friday.

**Bethlehem Community Center, Spartanburg, South Carolina **\$20,000.00****

Funds will be used to support existing programs related to the education of children and financial stability of families, specifically women. The educational program Students Obtaining Academic Readiness (SOAR) provides educational enrichment/academic support, character education, tutoring and homework assistance to students in the community. The Outreach program includes financial stability resources and provides financial literacy and computer skills to low income families.

**Bethlehem Community Center, Winston-Salem, North Carolina **\$15,000.00****
